About the Project

OSCE/ODIHR Regional Project in Georgia - Women's Rights Awareness, Gender Equality and Women's Participation in Society

In 2000 the OSCE/ODIHR started the programme "Women Leaders and NGO Coalition Development in Georgia". The Women NGO Coalition of Georgia currently unites up to 40 women's NGOs.

In May 2001 the OSCE/ODIHR started the Regional Project in Georgia "Women's Rights Awareness, Gender Equality and Women's Participation in Society" with participation of Women NGO Coalition members as local experts and regional coordinators.

During June-September 2001 the training sessions were held for local women in 11 regions throughout Georgia. 22 trainers from 11 regions underwent a two-stage trainer training conducted by the ODIHR's experts. 8 sessions were organized in each region, led by regional trainers. The regional training sessions were attended and later evaluated by the regional coordinators.

The goal of the programme was to raise awareness on women's rights and gender equality, and to promote women's active participation in society.
